2018/2019 was another busy and active year for the Board of Management of our school. The following summarises our work

Curricular Development

The teachers completed in-service training on the New Primary Languages Curriculum. Further training will be provided next year which will result in at least one closure in term 1 and some additional half days.

The Stay Safe Policy was devised this year and following on from this the eachers will engage with the professional development team in the PDST before the end of this school year to upskill in the area of SPHE and RSE.

School Self Evaluation – The staff have reengaged with SSE. The focus area is Literacy-specifically - vocabulary development.

Staffing 2019/2020

For 2019/2020 we will have the same allocation of teachers. 5 Mainstream Teachers and 2 Special Education Teachers. Our Principal is a teaching principal. We will share a part-time Special Education Teacher with Limerick School Project. We also have 2 SNA's – One for the infant school day and one for the full school day.
