- If at any time, your family is experiencing financial difficulty please speak to the class teacher or the principal in confidence.




Toys:

- Toys should be kept at home.
- 'Toy Days' will be organised during the year when children can bring in toys or objects from home.



Assembly:

- Assembly takes place every Wednesday at 9am.
- All students and teachers come together to celebrate their achievements and successes.
- Assembly creates a sense of belonging.
- We celebrate the ethos of the school through themes such as kindness, being safe and showing respect.
- Assembly takes place in the church as it is a large space where each child can sit comfortably.



Preparing for School

Reading

- Children will begin their reading journey in Junior Infants.
- We use a variety of approaches such as letter sounds, phonological awareness and story-time.
- Little books and sight words will be sent home as the year progresses.

Activities to try at home:

- reading aloud with your child.
- talking about the pictures in a book
- jigsaws and matching games

Writing

- Good writing is all about muscle and motor control.
- Saint Michael's N.S. uses cursive script.
- Lower case letters are taught first.
- Fine motor skills are developed throughout the year.

Activities to try at home:

- drawing and colouring.
- cutting or tearing paper
- construction work: lego, bricks
- manipulating material such as play dough

Health and Safety

At Saint Michael's N.S., we want to keep your child safe and well. Germs and viruses spread quickly in a classroom environment. In school, we encourage regular handwashing before and after using the toilet and before eating.

Ways to help:

Please show and help your child:

- how and when to wash their hands correctly.
- how to use a tissue to blow their nose correctly.
- to turn away and cough into their elbow.

Please contact the school if your child develops any contagious illness such as chicken pox.

- Keep your child at home until the contagious period is over.
- Please follow the latest COVID 19 guidelines.
- Keep your child out of school for 48 hours following vomiting or diarrhoea.
- Check regularly for head lice, treat immediately, and inform the class teacher.
- All information regarding your child and their health is kept in the strictest confidence.
