At the start of the year we welcomed new staff member, Ms. Laurianne Carmody, who was in a shared SET role with Limerick School Project. Term One saw the very welcome return of swimming lessons for pupils from 2nd - 6th class. We were delighted to be recipients of a STEM grant for over €8000 and we are looking forward to getting some interesting STEM projects up and running in the new school year.

Building work / upgrades

The school was successful in applying for an emergency works grant this year to upgrade the gas boiler, as the one was not heating the building sufficiently. This work was carried out during the Easter break and we are looking forward to seeing a big reduction in our gas bills next winter but also to having a much cosier school.

Limerick county is one of the counties selected to begin the roll out of solar PV for schools and we are delighted to have our solar panels installed in the final week of school. This will help to reduce our electricity bills in the coming years.


School Tours

Child Protection

The school's Designated Liaison Person is the school Principal Kate Gleeson. The Deputy Designated Liaison Person is Ann-Marie Mullane. They are legally obliged to refer all Child Protection matters to TUSLA. At each Board meeting, the Principal presents the Board with the Principal's Oversight Report. All child protection matters are strictly confidential.



Croke Park Hours

Both teachers and special needs assistants have completed their commitment to work their Croke Park Hours for 2023/2024.

Health & Safety

At the start of each term the staff carry out a health and safety risk assessment of the school, schoolyard and grounds. All maintenance issues are addressed in a timely manner.

A fire drill was carried out in each term.

School-Based Summer Programme

We are delighted to be offering a school-based summer inclusion programme again this year. The programme will run for two weeks. We are delighted to have teachers Jade Purcell and William Duddy and S.N.A.s Patricia Coombes and Simon Deevy who will work on this programme. They will be joined each day by a member of the In-School Management (ISM) team who will be in school as programme manager.

Curricular Development

New Curricula

All staff continue to engage with and implement the Primary Languages curriculum and the new Primary Mathematics curriculum. We are continuing to focus on oral language and 'maths talk', as these are areas that were identified by teachers as being a priority. We will continue to engage with staff training in these areas in the upcoming school year.

School Self Evaluation (SSE) / School Improvement Plan

This year we continued to focus on oral language development across the school. Teachers planned tasks and lessons to support oral language and identified and taught key vocabulary in different subject areas. We will now be reviewing and evaluating the work done in this area so far and this will feed back into our plan for next year.

Whole school curricular planning

The In-School Management (ISM) team of Kate Gleeson, Ann Marie Mullane, Maria Robinson and Mairéad Doran have been working together to look at whole school curricular planning, with a focus this year on literacy and maths. There was a new Primary Curriculum Framework published this year, with all curricula areas due to be revised in the coming years. The ISM team will begin to implement these new curricula when they are published in due course.

TUSLA Reporting on Pupil Attendance

The school completed all mandatory reports for TUSLA regarding pupil attendance and we will complete the end of year report on the last day of school. The school is legally obliged to inform TUSLA when any child over six years of age exceeds 15 days of absences.

School Enrolments

There are currently twelve Junior Infants enrolled for September. Projected enrolment for 2024/2025 is 117 pupils.

Principal Release Day arrangements

This year we were delighted to have Ms. Jade Purcell providing principal release cover for Saint Michael's NS, Gaelscoil Sheoirse Clancy and Children's Ark school. We will have a new arrangement next year as we are now allowed to combine our Principal release hours with our SET hours. Ms. Mairéad Doren will be filling this post next year.

EAL

This school year we had retained a full time EAL post and we also had ten additional EAL hours per week, which were filled by Ms. Jade Purcell. Unfortunately, the school has not retained its full-time post for next year. We appealed this decision but our appeal was rejected. We are extremely disappointed with this and will continue to try to have this post restored if possible.
